

**History 101 Latin American Revolutions**  
**Latin American Revolutions Blog Post**

**Name:**

Each student will compose a thoughtful blog post analyzing a recent news article about Latin American history or culture, and placing the topic in historical perspective. The best blog posts will: demonstrate a sophisticated understanding of the article presented; analyze the article's arguments, uses of evidence, and wider implications; consider how the article depicts Latin America; demonstrate critical thinking skills in their analysis of the topic's links to the wider course themes; encourage a discussion of the diversities of cultures and the varieties of historical experience; and employ effective oral communication skills in their brief oral presentations and audience Q&A.

<b>Analysis of Media Coverage of Latin America</b>	Descriptive comments about media depictions of Latin America.	Some consideration about author POV & depictions of Latin America.	Good consideration of how author POV relates to larger trends in coverage of Latin American topics.	Student considers multiple perspectives in their post, incorporating a strong analysis of author POV & how it shapes coverage.	
<b>Links to Course Themes</b>	Broad assessment or judgment based on unsubstantiated opinions.	General assessment that could be strengthened by specific examples.	Persuasive assessment well supported by specific examples. Clear links to course themes.	Multifaceted, compelling analysis making links to larger context. Insightful links to course themes.	
<b>Written Communication</b>	Communication of ideas undermined by writing issues.	Some writing issues that undermine communication or make the post less effective.	Good writing, logical organization. Uses images/links. No (or minor) grammatical errors).	Elegant writing. Skillful incorporation of digital images/links. No grammatical errors.	
<b>In-Class Presentation</b>	Student seems not to have thought about how to effectively present their information.	Main points are easy to follow, but presentation has issues with volume / pacing/ structure.	Clear, well organized presentation that highlights key points of the topic & engages audience.	Excellent, engaging presentation. Effective public speaking skills.
